Online Safety Tips for Pre-School Children

Thinking about the time of year, many children are likely to have new devices purchased for them for Christmas.

Here are some safety tips when setting up new devices:

1. Beware of screen time addiction

Think about limiting screen time for your child's device. This can be done in the settings or by using guided access on an apple device

2. Limit screen time

Over using screen can affect concentration, sleep and attitude.

Consider having no screens a couple of hours before bed

3. Think of others when taking photos

Check your child's device regularly to ensure they do not have inappropriate images

4. Make sure you set up parental controls

This means you will feel confident that they can use their device safely and independently anyone. This should be the parent's choice

5. Always secure the device with a password

This will help keep all of the information stored on the device private

6. Ensure location services are disabled

This can usually be done from the devices

privacy settings; or within the specific app



7. Always use a secure Wi-Fi network

When you use your Wi-Fi at home, this network is secure and password protected. If you choose to connect to a public network, these are less secure and can be accessed by anyone

8. Only pair with Bluetooth devices that are known to you

If connected via Bluetooth, information can be sent and received from another device.

Receiving attachments from unknown devices can leave your device open to receiving viruses

You should also consider setting up password controls or disable in-app purchasing so big bills are not run up accidentally!



Make sure location services are disabled so your child doesn't share their location accidentally
